

- Safety risk management


Previous and Near Future Funding

* These funds are intended for Capital Improvement Projects


Relief Grants



- ACRGP = Airport Coronavirus Response Grant Program grant in accordance with Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA)
- ARG = Airport Rescue Grant

Future Opportunities

- Revised ACIP submitted to the FAA on March 31, 2022
- Competitive Grant Opportunities
 - AIP Discretionary
 - AIG Competitive (through BIL)
 - Rural Surface Transportation Grant (through USDOT Multimodal Projects Discretionary Grant Program)
- Many of these opportunities will be gone in 4 years
- We need to be competitive and focused
