- Due to the expansive snow cover, there will be limited recreational opportunities in the Lakes Basin.
- Please walk/ride with caution on the road as the multi-use path (MUP) is not accessible at this time and there will be some vehicle traffic on the roads. Recreate safely around streams, lakes, and waterways as many of the lakes are still covered in ice.
