Town Council Meeting Agenda Items – July 17

- Town Council will participate in a workshop with the Board of Mammoth Lakes Recreation and consider approving the use of \$25,000 in Measure R Special Project Funds for custom CRC Sport Court Flooring.

Town Road and Multi-Use Path Construction Update

- This week, the Slurry Seal Project comes to a close with striping completed today. This project successfully sealed 200,000 plus square feet of roadways.
- The Road and Multi Use Path (MUP) Project includes the pulverization and repaving of roads and MUP's throughout Town. The Contractor began utility work last week along with full pulverization and grading work this week. The Contractor has made significant progress in preparing Kelly Road, Silver Tip Lane, and portions of Monterey Pine Road and Majestic Pines Drive for paving. Construction schedules have highly variable factors, however, we expect the Contractor to continue working in the same neighborhood for 1-2 weeks before moving onto reconstructing the MUPs. Continue to expect delays and/or detours as this work continues through August.
