Please describe how the requested funding for 2025 will be used:*

We will use the funds to directly support scholarships for students. Unfortunately, we receive limited funding from the schools to run this program, so the majority of the expenses are covered by our general fund. Any contributions made to the Ski PE Program will directly benefit the students involved. What makes our Ski PE Program with DSES especially unique is that students with disabilities can only participate if they are enrolled through DSES, ensuring a tailored and inclusive experience.

What other sources have you pursued to obtain funding?*

We have an agreement with the Mono County Office of Education (MCOE) which will pay \$20/lesson, and Mammoth Unified School District which will pay \$9/lesson per student. We receive individual donations and contributions that go into our general fund, which will be used to pay the remaining expenses for this program and provide scholarships to these students.

The Ski PE Program runs one session per week for ten weeks, and then there can be additional lessons scheduled independently for the students throughout the winter and summer time.

Number of adult volunteer hours involved with the program (specific program set up, maintenance, etc. - provide details):*

We normally have at least one volunteer on a Ski PE lesson (in addition to staff instructors). 31 kids \times 1 volunteer \times 3.5 hours \times 10 weeks = 1085 volunteer hours are associated with this program. This does not include 3 days of mandatory training that every volunteer must go through in order to volunteer at DSES.

What type of measures or procedures do you take to promote good sportsmanship among the players, coaches, and parents? Are there policies in place to discourage abusive behavior and language towards participants, coaches, and officials?*

We promote sportsmanship and positive behavior by fostering inclusion and understanding through sports, believing that participation alongside peers helps create a sense of acceptance and diversity. All students in our program engage on the same days and use the same transportation as their classmates, which not only benefits those in the program but also positively impacts the broader student body at MUSD. Additionally, each student has an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) that includes both educational goals and behavior management strategies, ensuring that any behavior challenges are addressed individually and with tailored support.

Outside of your program, what type of community programs or projects does your organization participate in?

We are passionate about supporting TOML and local community events and programs whenever possible. Some of our contributions include participating in the Hot Chocolate and Popcorn event for Halloween in the Trails, Town Clean-Up Day, the Adopt-A-Trail Program, and the Grand Fondo. We also assist with providing accessible entrances at summer festivals. In addition, our Second Chance Thrift Store donates to the community when needed, further strengthening our commitment to local support. As advocates for accessibility in town, we work to ensure that everyone has equal opportunities to participate and enjoy all that our community has to offer.
