MHS Boosters has not received any TOML Youth Sports funds; this is our first year applying. For this school year, MHS Boosters and the MHS sports teams expect to raise and spend approximately \$140,000.

In 2024, MHS Boosters awarded 36 senior scholarships, based on GPA.

Please describe how the requested funding for 2025 will be used:*

MHS Boosters would gratefully use 2025 TOML Youth Sports funding towards a Conex storage container; speaker system integration or a new scoreboard for the high school gym; and/or sports team travel expenses.

What other sources have you pursued to obtain funding?*

MHS Boosters and the individual MHS sports teams do extensive fundraising throughout the school year and sports seasons. Fundraisers include the annual Huskyfest golf tournament, Christmas tree lot sale, bingo, shifts at local events like Bluesapalooza, etc. We sell Boosters memberships and banners, and recruit private and corporate donations. Mammoth Unified School District provides \$30,000 travel allotment per school year (gas/mileage for school district vehicles) as well as coach stipends and substitute teacher costs, but is unable to cover the myriad other costs of high school sports, including uniforms, equipment, referee fees, competition fees, overnight travel costs, training camps, tournaments, awards and recognition, etc. The biggest single factor making MHS sports program expensive is our remote location and distance to competitors, i.e. team travel costs.

MHS Boosters participates in various community activities, including volunteering for MMCF, partnering with Mammoth Lakes Womens Club, and participating in VES Bingo events. MHS students and parents volunteer for many school district and community activities, including the school site committee, disabled sports, the Castoff thrift shop, the public library, and more.
