Ignite Adventure, Not Wildfires!

- As you enjoy summer in Mammoth Lakes, we're inviting everyone to <u>Ignite Adventure</u>, <u>Not Wildfire</u>. Multiple fires have already ignited this year in the Eastern Sierra, and dry conditions leave these landscapes at risk. Winds can pick up at any time and transform a small flame or spark into a devastating wildfire. This summer, consider these tips:
 - Stage 1 fire restrictions are in effect which means campfires and charcoal briquettes are only permitted in designated campgrounds!
 - o Look for Red Flag Warnings (especially wind!), which indicate elevated fire risk.
 - o Get a campfire permit if you have a fire or are using a stove or BBQ.
 - Pack a fire extinguisher, shovel, and water when camping or off-roading.
 - o Ensure your campfire is cold before leaving. Drown, Stir, Repeat.
 - o Stay on Trails. Off-roading in dry vegetation can spark fires.
 - Secure trailer chains to avoid creating sparks.
