Monday: Parents and campers will meet their counselors after school is dismissed at Mammoth Elementary School! We'll introduce you to the Group Up guides and assess your top-rope climbing skills!

Tuesday: Based off group's current skill level, counselors and Ground Up guides will decide on appropriate climbing adventures and skill progressions for the group.

Wednesday: We will take our climbing abilities to the ravine to learn how to boulder, spot, and use crash pads.

Thursday: Ground Up will join us again for some more top-rope fun! If time permits we will cool our feet off in a lake post climbing fun.

Friday: We will start off bouldering and end the day with our week wrap up and end-of-camp ice cream celebration at the Community Recreation Center.
